What is Open Data?

Open data is the idea that some data should be freely available to everyone to use and republish as they wish, without restrictions from copyright, patents or other mechanisms of control.



What is Open Data?

Availability and Access: the data must be available as a whole and at no more than a reasonable reproduction cost, preferably by downloading over the internet. The data must also be available in a convenient and modifiable form.

Re-use and Redistribution: the data must be provided under terms that permit re-use and redistribution including the intermixing with other datasets.

Universal Participation: everyone must be able to use, reuse and redistribute. There should be no discrimination against fields of endeavor or against persons or groups.

How is open data different from closed data?

Open data	Closed data
 Open data is accessible, usually via a data warehouse on the internet. It is available in a readable format. It's licensed as open source, which allows anyone to use the data or share it for noncommercial or commercial gain. 	 It is only available to certain individuals within an organization. The data is patented or proprietary. The data is semi-restricted to certain groups. Data that is open to the public through a licensure fee or other pre-requisite. Data that is difficult to access, such as paper records that haven't been digitized.




